Merrell needed a motorized wheelchair for safe mobility in the community, a cost covered by insurance. However,



insurance wouldn't cover a bariatric wheelchair essential for his residence. This specialized wheelchair not only aids his mobility but also strengthens his leg muscles. Thanks to your donations, Merrell now has both, ensuring his safety and health at home and in the community.

Patty required a fully electric hospital bed for her residence, crucial for maintaining her skin integrity and



overall health. While insurance only covered a basic bed, your support enabled us to provide Patty with the three-point bed she needed, offering greater comfort and care. This specialized bed not only enhances Patty's well-being but also facilitates safer and more effective support from our staff, ensuring she receives the assistance she needs with dignity and comfort.

Barbara's safety was at risk due to falls, prompting the need for a rescue alarm in her bedroom. With your help, she now has a fall prevention mat that alerts caregivers to any nighttime movements, ensuring her safety and independence.

During a family crisis, Sharon had to move abruptly, leaving her without necessities. Your donations allowed us to provide her with clothes, toiletries, and other essentials, offering comfort and stability during a challenging time.

Gale, like many others, faced financial barriers to accessing physical therapy. Your support relieved her of this burden, allowing her to use her own funds for social outings and community experiences, promoting both physical and mental well-being.

From outings to the Mystic Aquarium to visits to the Boston Museum of Science, your donations have enabled individuals to enjoy inclusive community experiences, fostering a sense of belonging and enhancing their overall quality of life.

Back to School with Kevin and Anitra

Have you ever had a passion or desire for a job you wanted, yet it just seemed out of reach? Meet Kevin. He is supported by our employment staff and has been looking for a job for over two years. Armed with a strong desire to cook and a warm and inviting personality, Kevin researched many opportunities and submitted applications. He had interviews but only passed the interviewing process in April of this year.

With assistance from Skills for Rhode Island's Future, Ashley Lawton, the new Manager of Employment Services for The Arc of Blackstone Valley, was able to secure Kevin a position as a temporary line cook at The Met, the main cafeteria at Rhode Island School of Design (RISD). On his first day, Ashley noted that he jumped right in, began taking orders, and fit right into place. Kevin's job duties include cooking in the kitchen, serving entrees, preparing food, and washing dishes. However, on Saturdays, he is needed to help with the grill for brunch, which is Kevin's favorite part of his duties.

Kevin's coworkers treat him as an equal, greeting him with a fist bump,

a cheerful hello, and asking about his weekend plans. His supervisors, who are professional chefs, offer Kevin feedback when corrections are needed or congratulate him on a job well done.

In a similar situation, Anitra began her current job (RISD) in the summer of 2023 with her employment coach. Last spring she worked on interview preparation, and researched jobs online in her areas of interest. Her previous work experience includes the former resale shop of The Arc of Blackstone Valley, New2You.

Nini, as she is called by her coworkers, can be found at the Café four days a week, packaging single serving food items and cleaning of the eating space. She says she loves her coworkers and her job. Anitra says her favorite part of her job is "serving the college students and preparing foods." She explains that her coworkers are extremely kind and helpful. They even brought her a cupcake and sang

> to her to help celebrate her birthday.

Outside of working, Kevin and Anitra are very active within The Arc of Blackstone Valley. They both serve the agency and the members of Citizens with Power, our selfadvocacy group. Kevin recently

served on the Board of Directors as the Member at Large, and Anitra ended her term as President of

The Arc of Blackstone Valley strives to meet the goal of inclusive employment for those we serve wishing to live their most independent lives. Anitra and Kevin are great examples of how inclusive employment adds value not only to the person with the disability but also to those with whom they work and interact. In fact, a recent Harvard Business Review article noted that companies hiring people with disabilities have a more collaborative workforce within the entire team. the new location for Flying Shuttles Art & Weaving Studio at 390 Pine Street in Pawtucket. The Flying Shuttles studio seized upon an opportunity to relocate when Shri Yoga relocated to the same building earlier this year as the location provided a community connection for art, housing, and outreach in a revitalized mill building in Pawtucket.

The new space provides the artists with inspiration and chances to develop more relationships with others. Damon, a weaving and cross stitch artist and Shri Yoga Instructor, said the new space is "Awesome! I love Shuttles and getting to do Yoga right next door." Donna, a fellow weaving artist, agreed she likes the

new space "...because everything is in the same building. To go to yoga and come back is easy."

Flying Shuttles currently has 19 artists who work at the studio throughout the week. Also new this year the artists are embracing an additional way to sell their works, an online marketplace. With special thanks to the John E. Fogarty Foundation for their support in helping the online marketplace come to fruition, the artists are now utilizing the website as a way of connecting with more people in the public.

Program Manager of the Studio, Lisa Brien, said "This is a great opportunity for them to sell more of their artworks, and provides more exposure for (the



public) to learn more about (the artists) and their artworks." Brien and her staff are also helping the artists to develop business skills, which she explained is an important aspect of the studio's mission.

Donna, a weaving artist, agreed that the online marketplace was a positive move for the studio, saying that more people will be able to see their art. Damon agreed saying, "I think it's great; it will be more money when we sell more."

Flying Shuttles artists have been hard at work creating so many new pieces of art for the online marketplace, in the studio, and for upcoming shows.
