

Her vision includes designing a building-wide mural for the recently purchased Grant Building focusing on each of the businesses in the newly renovated space called "Still on Main." During our interview Brenda pointed across the street and said. "There were some amazing old

buildings and businesses at one time here and across the street, so I would include the old and the new together in the mural hoping that people would come back to the city and see the changes."

What is inspiring about Brenda's business plan and work ethic is her own personal desire to support causes that are important to her. She would like to be able to contribute to animal rescue organizations including programs that help animals with disabling conditions. She would like to help support her family as well and cares about feeding children in need.

Brenda had several goals in her business plan including: to increase her art sales by 10%, to research, develop and test market one new art product and to set up an Instagram account to promote her art and invite followers.
